Regarding on taking regular exams when students are diagnosed with Covid-19 or become a close contact.

In principle, the regular exams in the 4th quarter will be held face-to-face. <u>However, if you test positive for COVID-19 or are identified as a close contact with an infected person, even if you are asymptomatic, please do not take the exams and inform us as follows.</u>

Due date: In principle, before the start of the relevant examination.

Person to Contact: Teacher in charge of each examination

(Please contact them directly via LMS or e-mail.)

Information to be reported:

- · Your affiliation, student number, and name
- · Emergency contact information (Tel, e-mail)
- The date you were notified that you are infected or are a close contact.
- How long you are instructed to stay or recover at home by a doctor or Public Health Center. (Start and end dates)

The examinations might be conducted online (including submission of reports or assignments through online). Therefore, always check all notifications particularly from your department/graduate school. Also, be sure to know the contact information of teacher in charge of your classes and your affiliated student affairs section* in advance for emergencies.

Cheating in examinations is subject to a disciplinary action in accordance with the "Rules for Disciplinary Actions against Students of Kanazawa University". All credits for the semester will be invalid and you will be suspended. Be aware of your responsibilities as a student and take the examinations fairly, both in person and online. These disciplinary actions also apply to submission of reports or assignments through online.

Thorough prevention of infections

There are still some high-risk behaviors such as driving with more than one person, karaoke, eating and drinking, and staying overnight at a friend's house in the behavior history of those who tested positive. The measures below help you to avoid situations of close contact and a risk of breathing airborne droplets. They also limit the impact scope if infections occur unlikely. Please follow basic infection prevention measures to avoid infecting not only yourself but also others.

- Wear a mask and disinfect your hands whenever you are on campus or going out.
- Avoid the activities with high risk of infection, such as eating and drinking, karaoke in large groups, and the situations of "Three Cs". <u>Eating and drinking with friends</u>, and sleeping overnight at their house are strictly prohibited.
- <u>Take your temperature***</u> every morning. If you have a fever or other health problems, do not come to school and stay at home.
- Contact your affiliated student affairs section*immediately when you are in the following cases.
 - (1) When you undergo a PCR test.
 - ② When you become a close contact and are required to stay at home by the public health center.
 - ③ When someone close to you is diagnosed with COVID-19 and you may be a close contact.
