Global Graduate 22 July - 2 August

Language Summer School 8 July - 19 August

The Language Academy is accredited by the British Council and is recognised for its facilities, course design and care of students

The language summer school is a vibrant programme attracting around 200 students each year from a range of countries.

Running all summer, students can choose to study from 1-4 weeks.

Class hours: 17 hours per week, plus additional weekly trip.

Cost: £650/week, including accommodation and weekly trip.

Each week students have a choice of two themes related to English language and culture. Students study in small interactive classes focussing on their communication skills. As well as their English class, each Wednesday, students go on a trip to a local place of interest such as Liverpool, Manchester and the Lake District.
